

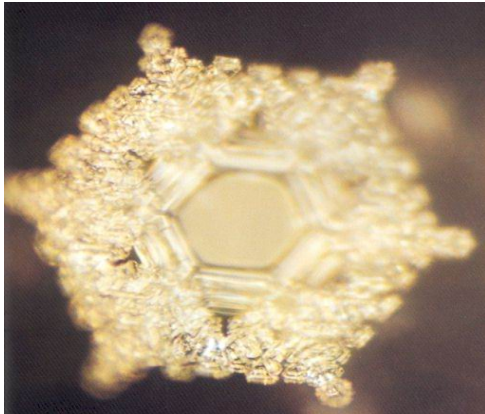

What does it mean to be a Mapmaker?

Are answers to be found in what we know, or does what we know assist us in leaping into the unknown?

Quote from "What the Bleep ... "

Could it be that what we know springboards us into new questions, new answers, new realities? What is the nature of being a mapmaker and what qualities does a mapmaker possess? How can we perceive this? Also, is it a choice made in this lifetime or was the choice made at the time of choosing this incarnation or before? I don't propose to have the answers but it is worth taking a philosophical look at this question if for no other reason than to acknowledge the "unusual" terrain.

To do this we will explore what science refers to as memory fields, revisit the question of reality, and look at the impact of the difference between resolving each problem as it arises and doing great work – great work in the context of this article, refers to being a Mapmaker.

I've been reading a bit of late and it seems that science has indeed caught up to the kind of work we did over 10 years ago with Esoteric Training 1. It is kind of interesting to hear what they have to say because it may shed some light on any loose ends we may have. It is also interesting to note that having theories that challenge the status quo in any field of science can be a lonely place. People in all walks of life appear to not like having their belief systems challenged.

We all know about the 100th Monkey Principle. Sheldrake's theory explains this as "morphic resonance". He says that there is an inherent memory, which he calls morphic fields. The following is the explanation. There are all kinds of forms and patterns of behaviour in humans, animals and plants that exists in nature. Each species, he says, has a collective memory. The more similar something is to something that has happened before the greater the resonance. His field is biology and when investigating research done in animal behaviour on rats learning new tricks, he noted that new generations of rats learn quicker and quicker.

In one of the biggest series of experiments even done, which started at Harvard, then continued in Scotland, and concluded in Melbourne, the rats got quicker and quicker as time went on. By the time the experiment was underway in Melbourne they found that it didn't just persist in descendants of trained rats, it occurred in all the rats of that breed.

In other words, what may be slow and difficult to start with in either teaching new tricks to rats, or crystallising new compounds, or learning about the Observer and objective reality, as was the case in Esoteric Training 1, eventually new pathways are open to all. So what may take quite a bit of effort in the first instance, if persisted with "lab rats", then a new pattern is eventually established for all to follow.

This no doubt is why Patrick is saying that the work done in ET1 is now exoteric. Esotericists have to continually move into new horizons thereby creating new maps.

Sheldrake claims that even when you extract or exclude the logical explanations the increasing rate of transfer around the world of a new practice, a new discovery etc. is due to a field of inherent memory in nature – a field he calls morphic resonance (morphe is a Greek word for ‘form’).

Physicist, David Bohm has contemplated how it works. It may be, he believes, that things that happen go beyond what we call space and time then fold back into the world. Many different models exist including the idea of extra dimensions and morphic ether, but Sheldrake points out that the how doesn't matter. What matters is the observation that this does happen.

One review of Sheldrake's *The Rebirth of Nature* said that, “science is not threatened by the imaginative ideas of the Sheldrakes of the world, but by those who would censor them.” With *What the Bleep ...* and other enlightening materials, it is probable that the censor aspect is not and cannot dampen the imagination, even in somewhat cynical halls of scientific endeavour.

Sheldrake's idea is based around the notion that everything in nature is evolving. What appears to resist then, he claims is a metaphor of habit, in an evolving organic, developing universe. That doesn't seem such a bad description of what might hold us back at times. For instance is it habit to duck back into the “safety” of the cage to talk to the residents there about what you are about to do, just as you were about to soar? Is then one likely habit the need for external validation and/or approval? Not everyone is a mapmaker.

Let's now revisit reality... I read an article recently by Diviana wherein she introduced the name, “Holographic Interconnected Paradigm”, or “HIP”. Holograms, she said, hold the “collective consciousness”. Also, that time and space collapse in a holographic universe and nothing is truly separate from anything else. She consulted several physicists' explanation of instantaneous communication of sub-atomic particles, such as electrons, regardless of distance.

There is a reality we call “objective reality”. As I understand it objective reality is a matter of interpretation. In social sciences we call this “subjective reality”, however in physics and in esoterics the question is, “is that chair really solid or have I made it so?” Many physicists have concluded that despite an apparent solidity, objective reality does not exist.

Bruce Cathie, a Mathematician, explains the illusionary aspect of reality quite well. He discovered that reality is not a constant. To explain this he compares reality to a piece of filmstrip. The filmstrip is static, he says, until fed through a projector. This gives it the illusion of passing through time. This he said is how our reality works.

Lets then look at the question of nothing being truly separate from anything else. Diviana, in her article, reminds us that if you take a tiny piece of a hologram you will see the pattern of the whole. She looked at work done by Karl Pribram, a neurophysiologist, on the brain. He had concluded that the brain itself is a hologram. She claimed it would have to be considering the universe is one infinite hologram. Further, it has been shown that memory is not confined to one area of the brain. Rather, memories are encoded in patterns of nerve impulses throughout the brain.

Matter, Diviana said, is nothing more than “waveforms”, therefore, she concluded, our reality is a holographic illusion. Is this what we mean when we say, “as above, so below”?

So what about doing great work versus attending only to solving problems? Resolving problems that arise can absorb one's day. After a while one realizes that is the sum total of existence – solving problems. Sure problems can arise but in doing great work in stepping into the unknown, it may be important to consider that “it ain't what you do, it's the way that you do it”, or, it's the way that you view it. Dr. Richard Hamming in an article *You and Your Research* addressed the question of doing great work. Great work he considered to be of Nobel Prize status for researchers. Many, he had observed, just addressed the problems that arose rather than going beyond them and addressing groundbreaking research. The answer he suggested was to go beyond the immediate question, as I read it. It relates I felt to approaching life in all contexts, especially that of a mapmaker.

In the ordinary world it is easy to see life as a matter of resolving each problem as it arises. Life is then seen and experienced as a series of problems. For a mapmaker, whether the problems are similar or different, the tools one uses are quite different to those available in the ordinary world. However, let's look at this from the aspect suggested, that is, if the questions were changed the method of approach would change. What might this mean for a mapmaker then?

What questions would change the way one went about it? What would make it great? Perhaps the answer is simple enough as asking oneself, “what is my authentic swing?” (To understand more about “authentic swing” watch the movie *The Legend of Bagger Vance* through the eyes of an esotericist.) Perhaps then it would be a matter of asking ourselves the question of how we could incorporate it in our life, so that we become our authentic swing and our authentic swing becomes us. Is it as simple as that or should it be more complicated!

Another point that was made in this article was the suggestion to “work with the door open”. The idea was that if the door is open you will get clues as to what the world is and what may be important. So how would a mapmaker “work with the door open”? Engaging in one's world with an open mind seems like a very good place to start. Occasionally something said, done or seen triggers a thought. If this thought comes from pure mind it may be the key to what next! It has the effect of a kind of springboard. Newton's rule states that, “if I have seen further than others, it is because I've stood on the shoulders of giants”.

From the articles and research referred to above and the passing reference to *What the Bleep ...* four thoughts glow from the dark. Firstly, that esoterics as a subject evolves, therefore if one is a mapmaker then they too need to continually evolve. Secondly, to be a mapmaker one must continually surrender to the unknown. Thirdly, an esotericist never waits for anyone and fourthly, that to have impact as a mapmaker, it may be that one must be prepared to live in the paradoxes without the need for external validation.

Remember the song from Esoteric Training 2 – “Open your heart, see what’s inside, bring it unto your people. Open your mind, see what’s inside, bring it unto your people”? These words for me bring new meaning to the scope of what has, is and always will be made possible if we allow ourselves to open these chambers of secrets and keep them open!

Finally, it must be magic don’t you think? Isn’t that what we are truly here for – to experience the magic of life and to make it possible for other to as well by creating new maps – maps that impact on consciousness? I’m sure we will find out more about this in Patrick’s new course *Simply Magick*.

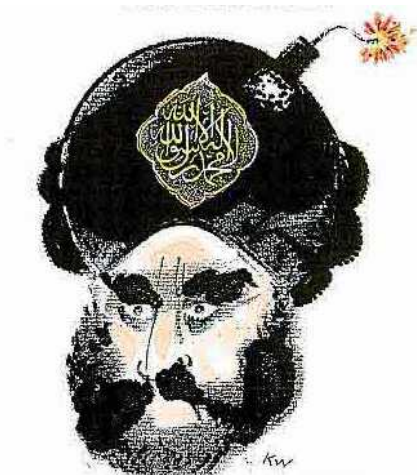
