

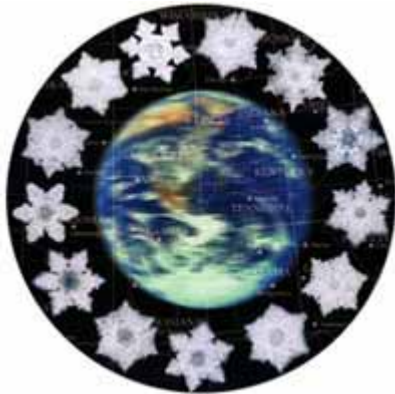

Casting no shadow...

One of the questions asked in the interview with Dr. Masaru Emoto (mentioned above) was **What has startled or puzzled you the most in your research?** This was his answer...

When we obtained beautiful water crystals from water, which we assumed there should not be beautiful water crystals obtained. However, I entered the deep world of water from this experience. I found out that there are photographers who can only take images of molecule level and photographers who can take images of particle level and sometimes the result is totally different depending on who takes pictures.

Is this the type of answer one may glean from the space between? Is this response reflective of a beautiful dance between the intellect and the mind within? Is this the space where no shadows fall, just pure thought? And finally, why did this statement jump out at me?

We'll start with the last question first... there is an 'I' that exists for all that is said or written so perhaps lets situate the I that speaks here. Here I sit with a mountain of reading to be done on the desk behind me for writing my thesis. I've dipped my toe in the water but I haven't actually dived in just yet. I have started writing though and exchanged my written words for comment from my supervisor. "Good start" I am told, "now re-organize around the themes that interest you." It will be exciting once I can harness my focus but I have allowed a few distractions. Once again I get to see what attitude no longer serves me if I am to successfully pursue what I say I want to. Possibly this statement jumped out at me because I'm interested in taking the best picture I can!

Now to the other questions... whatever may be our focus of interest, and it probably is a very good idea to have one, all that supports our view and all that opposes it will probably surface in the beginning. Then if we go further into our focus having become conscious of the range of views having surfaced, it could be that this space is the space between – the space between opposing thoughts be they ours or just thoughts that exist on this topic that we have unwittingly tapped through our focus of interest. I am suggesting that Masaru Emoto explained this space above when he said *I entered the deep world of water from this experience.*

We all have an intellect and we all have a mind. Even for a metaphysician there may be times when the intellect might want to squash the mind and vice versa. Again though, if we allow them both to exist they will probably do us a great service for this is where our unique viewing point will emerge. It was when Masaru Emoto had gone as far as he could with his intellect that he became interested in the concept of micro cluster water and Magnetic Resonance Analysis technology. It was stated in the interview that it was then that his quest began to discover the mystery of water.

What is of interest in the context of this article is how he identified this quest... *I undertook research of water around the planet not so much as a scientific research but as an original thinker, as a human being.* Is this not a dance between the intellect and the mind? Didn't his attitude allow him to make observations that might not have been made using just the intellect or just the mind? By the by, aren't we the richer that he followed his passion in the way he did.

When it comes to scientific discoveries we can sometimes feel at the mercy of the scientist, particularly when we know that we can influence our observational findings with our thoughts on what we want to happen. However, if the scientist is following his or her heart's desire to discover for the sake of curiosity and not because a certain finding is essential because of the funding or the ego's expectation, then what is found is more likely to be of pure mind. This may sound contradictory after all I am talking about both the intellect and the mind being of value, but does pure mind mean no intellect? Isn't it merely changing the order of value?

Back to the question of why this statement jumped out at me? Was it to remind me of the slow-burning strength of humility? Ultimately it seems to clear the slate or start with a blank page one has to recognize a depth of humility that isn't necessarily required in one's everyday life. To teach with passion, to research with passion and to live one's daily life with passion will only be 'the best I can do' if the slate is clean or the page is blank. Now Masaru Emoto responded to the question of what most puzzled him in his research by saying it was an assumption that took him further into his research than if he hadn't had the assumption in the first place. Wasn't this the intellect and the mind working together? What I mean is that something unexpected happened. Emoto and his team curiously responded by going where the intellect by itself had never been before. His statement also reminded of another statement... **we are spiritual beings having a human experience.** In the context of the answer Emoto gave one can get a whiff of the humility required to dare to live a simple and passionate life, being grateful and appreciative for all that unfolds. And further, perhaps there is a sense of destiny and purpose that only each one of us can live?

In its fullness his response reminded me of the aloneness involved in undertaking one's own path. There exists just you, the researcher, the teacher, the liver of life, and your canvas. What is revealed and how it is interpreted is entirely and uniquely your own. Perhaps it is a mindset that allows one's uniqueness to be lived... a mindset involving a dance between the mind and the intellect... a mindset that Emoto eloquently explained as one of an original thinker, one of a human being.

Finally, could it be when we want something and we receive more than we could imagine it is the space that casts no shadow between the intellect and the mind that has allowed the delivery?

## Editor's comment...

However after a recent bout of a hospital stay and a short but somewhat incapacitated recovery at home I had quoted to me some Latin. When asked what it meant I was told, *I am afraid of dying*. These beautiful people know exactly what they want in health and support euthanasia, etc. In other words, the intellect has taken them to the point of reason and in a moment of reflection they both glimpsed a fear that the intellect cannot fathom.

Whilst flicking channels recently I witnessed briefly what could be regarded as a need to attack what one cannot comprehend. It was an attack on the movie *The Secret*. A psychologist had been drawn in to dispute the possibility that we can heal ourselves with our thoughts.

I remember something Patrick said once... if you believe that God does not exist it doesn't mean that this is the truth it just means you don't believe. Belief doesn't necessarily reflect actuality it just provides us with foundations upon which we build our lives. It would be a shame then to discount the concept of God just because religion has misused it to control masses of people.
