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## An Abundant Life ...

*The article this month is another from the series of interviews with 'elders'. The extracts chosen have been included for various reasons... the brilliant yet simple interview technique that draws out thoughtful response; and because the interviewee seems to be expressing a life lived moment to moment... given her circumstances she could have sunk or swam.*

*The interviewer is Andrew Denton and it is from the program, Enough Rope... hope you enjoy!*



Her life reads like a Hollywood script. A grandmother who communed with the dead... an uncle who ruled the country... a bloody coup and escape into exile. From there, what started, as a letter to her grandfather became her first book. She's begun the 15 books since on the same day she began that one, January

the 8th. So far she's sold 51 million of them. From Chile, 65 year old author **Isabel Allende**.

**On September 11, 1973, Isabel's world changed completely when Salvador Allende was overthrown in a CIA backed military coup. Violence and chaos ensued. Forced to flee to Venezuela with the children, Isabel had no way of knowing it would be nearly two decades before she would return home.**

ISABEL ALLENDE: The military coup changed the lives of almost every Chilean. Even those who supported the coup and who liked Pinochet - their lives also changed. The families were broken. In my case, I was 30 years old, I realised that there was a dimension of violence, cruelty and horror that was always present in the world, in everybody's lives and some very fortunate people never have to confront it but most people do, sooner or later, and we have to learn to live with it and learn to oppose it. Once I understood that, I realised that I have to fight that in my own soul always and I have to fight against it in the world as well. I'm not above anybody. I'm not better than anybody. I am made of the same material that everybody else is and if somebody can be a saint, so can I and if somebody can be a torturer, so can I. So it's really important for me to be aware of that so that I can act against it.

*Perhaps Isabel's remarks above will make the hairs stand up on the back of the collective neck!*

*What makes a good interviewer is asking the right questions... questions that inspire the one interviewed to reflect and recontextualize their experiences. A sense of belonging is an interesting concept and an interesting human need. In Isabel's case the question of belonging was brought to the surface after having to hastily depart from her home country of Chile...*

ANDREW DENTON: You left Chile and you went into exile because your life was in danger. What is it like not to have a place to belong?

ISABEL ALLENDE: At the beginning I was totally paralysed by nostalgia, the feeling that everything had been taken away from me. I had lost my family, my house, my in-laws that I adored, even my dog, my job of course, everything that was dear to me, and my country. Your country is the place where you don't have to ask... you know the code, you know the clues, you know the jokes, you have the references and you get the accent. You look at a person and you know exactly where that person stands in the society. You only have that in your own country and of course I lost it when I left Chile. I became a writer because I was living in exile and I needed to... my first book was an attempt to recover what I had lost. So in a way now I have my country in my books.

Where does courage come from to live always and in every moment being totally honest with self? Mostly people invent reason. Remember... the question asked makes all the difference...

**In exile, Isabel's marriage of 29 years to Miguel slowly died.**

ANDREW DENTON: We always make a virtue of marriage. Should we also make a virtue of knowing how to part?

ISABEL ALLENDE: I was lucky. I was married to a very good man - a man with a very even temperament always, a man who really loved me - a very decent person. We were together for so long and one day I said, *"This is over, I really don't think that we can continue together."* He said, *"I've also noticed that something is just not there for us any more and maybe we should separate for a while."* And I said, *"Yes, I thought the same thing."* He said, *"Well we have to think about it."* And I said, *"We've already thought about it for many years, let's do it today."* And he said, *"Today?"* *"Yeah, today. Let's call the kids and tell them."* And I'm not exaggerating, within 24 hours we broke up and he left to a rented apartment, we divided the furniture, the plants, the books, the music, even the dogs, one dog for him and one dog for me and we separated our lives. We never called a lawyer and we wrote in the computer a sort of agreement of how we would divide our assets, and the children, Nicolás and Paula, signed as witnesses. That was the end of 29 years of our common life. I never hated my husband and I know that he never hated me. We respected each other. In many ways we just didn't have anything in common.

Life is made up of moments and when we put the moments together we say, 'this has been my life experience'. Then when breaking down those moments, as happens when verbalizing or writing about experience, the reader/listener can identify and know the nature of being. Being then is made up of how moments are dealt with in a life...

**At 45, single, and certain that she would remain that way, Isabel met an Australian (or was that American?) called Willie Gordon. What came next surprised both of them.**

ISABEL ALLENDE: We met in 1987. I was passing by, rushing in on a book tour, met him, had a one-night stand with him and then he took me to the airport the next day and I said, *"Do we have some kind of commitment?"*

He had to pull the car over. He couldn't believe his ears. You see I didn't know then that you never ever mention the word commitment in front of a western male and he said,

*"What are you talking about, we just met?"*

And I said, *"Yes, but I live in Venezuela, I'm 45 years old, I don't have any time to waste so I need to know where I stand."*

All too often, we end up running when we ought to be standing still - or looking in any direction other than the one that is most likely to enlighten us.

And he said, "Look I'm going to visit you in December, eh... I just cannot answer that question."

And I said, "December? This is October. I can be dead by December."

He said, "Why, are you sick?"

I said, "No, I'm not sick but I live in a very dangerous country" and he said, "No, ah we don't have any kind of commitment."

So I got on the plane and I thought about it. Then I decided that I would get him out of my system, come back, spend a week with him without an invitation and then, go back to my old life. Here I am 20 years later.

ANDREW DENTON: He's still wondering what happened I'm sure.

ISABEL ALLENDE: What happened? He never got over it.

Theoretically speaking, left to own devices with an ability to think for self and be responsible for own actions, all that matters will be revealed. Of course some of us have an 'unfair advantage'.... but all the same, everyone potentially knows what they have come here to learn in this incarnation... the detail is revealed in the experience of life... the experience will depend upon our thoughts & feelings and our response, i.e. action or inaction, to them...

ANDREW DENTON: In your memoire you say a really interesting thing that urgency is inseparable from love. What do you mean by that?

ISABEL ALLENDE: I think that I said that in the context of these long dating processes that people go through and they never get married and by the time they get married they are bored... to me everything that you want passionately, you want it now with extreme urgency and I want to change the world with urgency in the same way that I want Willy urgently in my bed today. So when I met Willy we became a couple, not because he wanted it. I needed a visa, that's why we married.

ANDREW DENTON: What is the secret to a good sex life?

ISABEL ALLENDE: Oh love. To me... I mean when I was young I would have answered differently but after 50, love. I would feel extremely embarrassed if I had to take off my clothes in front of somebody I don't know very well and I know that person accepts me and loves me fully. Also the body changes and when you have a regular companion that you have sex with, you learn to change with that person.

ANDREW DENTON: And how do you stop boredom becoming an issue?

ISABEL ALLENDE: I think that that's probably more an issue for men - that more men need more variety than women do. Women need more quality and intensity. You know even if I had the chance, I wouldn't want many partners. I would find that boring. Probably men think differently.

ANDREW DENTON: Yeah I fantasize a lot but I fantasize about being someone else. Is that...?

ISABEL ALLENDE: Oh I fantasize also about being someone else.

ANDREW DENTON: I'm Antonio Banderas, who are you?

ISABEL ALLENDE: I'm a tall blonde with big boobs.

ANDREW DENTON: We must meet some time.

Life is made up of a series of relationships. It is what we make of them that define us. How we relate to our mother can have powerful repercussions. What is interesting in Isabel's next response is how powerful and how simple acceptance is.

**Isabel's 16 books have all had the same editor, her mother, Donna Panchita. Although they've spend most of their lives in separate countries, Isabel still writes to her every day. She calls her mother 'the keeper of memory'.**

ISABEL ALLENDE: We have always been best friends, sisters. She's 21 years older than I am. I know where I'm going to be in 21 years. She opens the way for me. She teaches me a lot and I do all the stuff that my mother never could do. I am out there in the world fighting the battles that she could not fight and in a way she feels empowered and happy because I've done all that in the world. When I was very young she was scared for me, she didn't want me to be a feminist. She thought I was going to get a lot of aggression, never find a husband, be terribly unhappy and look ugly. Then years later when she saw that I was willing to take the aggression, because for every blow I got I could give two, she felt that her life was justified by the work I did. So she's a great fan of what I do.

ANDREW DENTON: What has your mum taught you about getting older?

ISABEL ALLENDE: My mum said that as you age you have to smell good and be clean and don't hate anybody because that makes you older. I don't agree. I think that of course you have to smell good and be clean but there's much more that you have to do. Don't complain, exercise, be strong, work, be creative, be related to the world, have causes, fight for them passionately. I think all those things are important. I'm not going to give up and just smell good.

There is not one life on this plane that does not experience loss that causes us to think about living and dying. It can be one of those introspective moments that brings peace of mind...

**Of all the books Isabel has written, one means more to her than any other. It's called *Paula* and it's about the death of her daughter while in the care of a hospital.**

ANDREW DENTON: You said that you had an epiphany about Paula's death, that birth and death are the same.

ISABEL ALLENDE: Yes.

ANDREW DENTON: In what way?

ISABEL ALLENDE: Paula died at home and the night that she died we were all around her bed. Two babies were at the foot of her bed. I was in her bed with her holding her and her brother was holding her hand. We were all around her and it took the whole day and all night. She died around 3 o'clock in the morning and as the hours went by, there was some stillness, some silence that settled down and somehow everything became like a photograph, still. And there was effort in death. Dying is not easy. It's a very hard transition. And then there was the moment when she died. And when she died we all had the feeling that she had crossed a threshold into another world, to something else.

Life is a great big canvas, and you should throw all the paint you can on it.

Later, in that same room, in that same space my granddaughter was born. There was a moment, an extraordinary moment when I took the baby, I held the baby in my hands and it was a door, a transition. She came through a threshold as my daughter had gone through a threshold into another life. And I remember that when I was holding my granddaughter, the question was, *tell me, tell me what is there on the other side before you forget?* It was so intense and so similar and there was the same stillness and silence. It was a sacred moment. So I think that the night that Paula died I lost the fear of death and the moment I received my first granddaughter, I lost the fear of life.

ANDREW DENTON: Your mother said *"Don't be angry because that makes you old"* but you found out that Paula had died because of medical negligence. How did you deal with what must have been anger?

ISABEL ALLENDE: I got over the anger very fast because I realised there was no bad intention. Nobody tried to harm her. There was a series of really awful coincidences, awful circumstances. The hospital was on strike, it was a long weekend, the doctor wasn't available, then there was a power shortage in intensive care, she didn't receive enough oxygen. The thing that made me most angry was the cover up that they tried, they made me believe that Paula was going to wake up some day.

**Finally, Andrew asked... You said that you want to lead a passionate life till the day you die. How would you define that?**

ISABEL ALLENDE: Outside myself. I don't want to be looking inside my ego, my stuff, my achievements, my me, me, me, me, I hate that stuff. I just want to be out there to the last day of my life interested in the world, in causes, in helping other people. That doesn't mean that I don't have a spiritual practice, that I don't look at my own soul, that I don't prepare myself for the transition that death is but I cannot sit in meditation to contemplate my navel for the rest of my life. That would be boring for me.

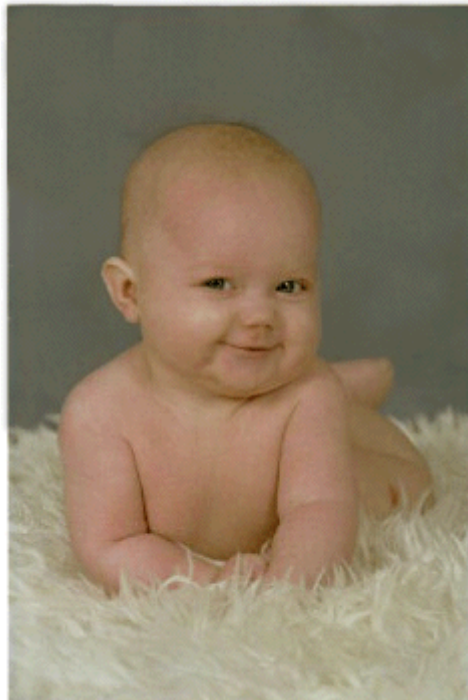

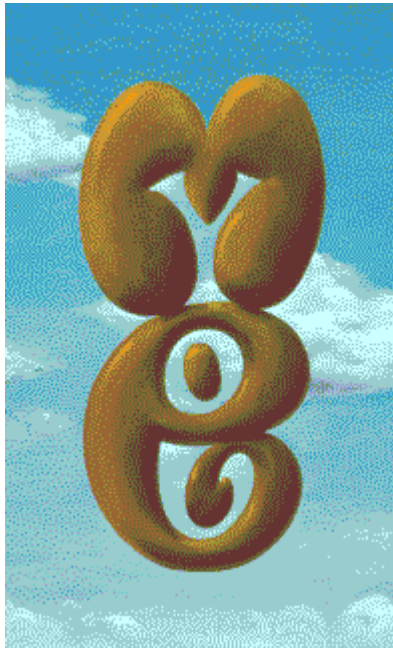

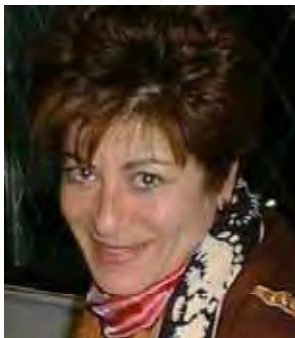
Greetings...

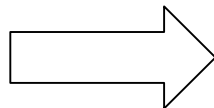

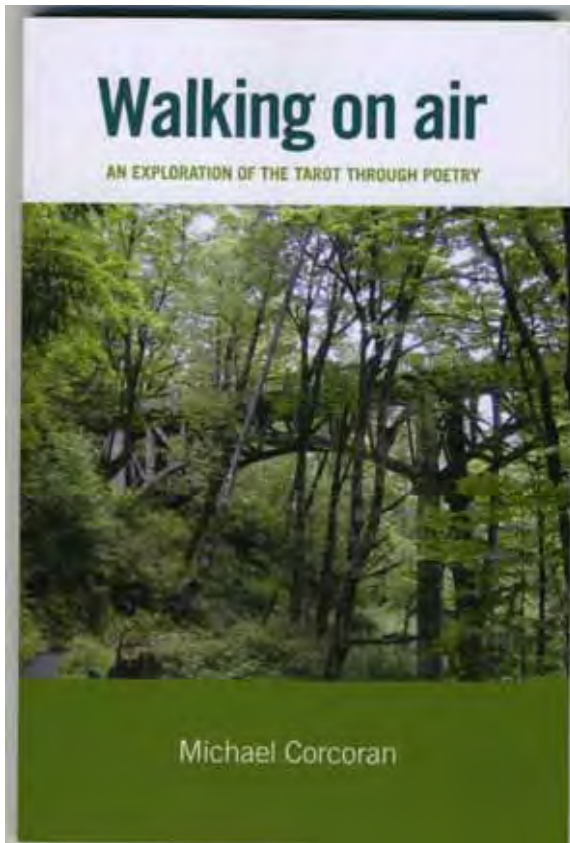
