Right now in our world I am seeing, hearing and having sent to me much information about scientific discoveries. For instance, science is revealing how our thoughts create our reality, how our DNA is affected by our feelings and making suggestions that through our sub-conscious mind we may be able to predict the future.

Recently, I received an email from a business acquaintance in which he was hailing the intellectual capacity of an individual whose conversations wholly revolve around what has been proven – logic is the window through which they view the world. Whilst the ability he was referring to is valuable in context, it does have its limits. Those limits are to do with the blinding light of the intellect that prevents us from seeing and knowing beyond it.

I did though have access to theoretical concepts and read about or listened to many great minds analysing, discussing and evaluating. Eventually though this space did not welcome a mind that would challenge and reveal certain dependencies underlying the nature of every form of relationship.

So I thought it would be interesting to look at some of the scientific revelations that have been made, remembering two things. Firstly, that we have more scientists incarnated in our world than ever before, and secondly, that our studies in metaphysics has allowed us to think and ultimately to experience a life that can be lived beyond the intellect but with the support of it.

The idea is not to argue one against the other, but attempt to reveal something of the mystery of this relationship. In order to provide a more wholesome picture I have included stories and insights whose basis does not depend upon a logical discourse.

It can be quite grounding or even authoritative to have the security of a scientific revelation to guide our thinking, or it can be interesting or amazing and supportive of what we already know but couldn't have expressed it so coherently. Perhaps that is what science is, a coherent frequency!

One such discovery is that of a Black Box that appears to be able to see into the future. It is a small box that churns out random numbers. It contains a small complex microchip. Scientists claim this box to have extraordinary powers, as it is capable of predicting major world events.

It sensed the September 11 attacks on the World Trade Centre four hours before they happened and last December, it seemed to forewarn the Asian tsunami.

They are still trying to understand what is going on and have involved the Global Consciousness Project to help them. They are hopeful that they may be able to provide a solid scientific grounding for phenomena such as 'déjà vu' and intuition. Also, they speculate that one day they may be able to enhance psychic powers using machines that can 'tune in' to our subconscious mind.

I was reminded here of work being researched over 10 years ago by my brother, who at the time was an Associate Professor in Mathematics & Physics at Macquarie University. He had coined the phrase 'intuitive logic' and was working on proving its validity. Quantum Physics has enabled many a scientific mind to expand their research and tap into a more esoteric knowledge base.

At this stage the 'black box' scientists are optimistic. In the short term they know their discovery can help them predict a major world event. Their machine though cannot tell them what the event will be or where it will happen.

What this discovery has done though is to open up the intellect to the possibility that we are all connected to what they have termed a global consciousness. They are in fact challenging both demonstrably and mindfully the notion of separation, and making it possible for a greater paradigm shift in the scientific community.

So when the intellect is in its proper place, what else can be revealed and accepted by us? Late last year a good friend in Calgary, Canada sent me an article called *Messages from Water*. I have just seen the movie, *What the Bleep do we Know* in which there is a scene where it demonstrates crystal patterns that form in water when a thought pattern is attached.

When Amanda in this movie, misses her train, she stumbles on an exhibit of water photographs. These photographs are the result from research done by Dr. Masaru Emoto. His works are published in two books, *The Message of Water, Vol. 1 and 2*, with a third volume recently released wherein he explores hidden messages in water.

What he did in this more recent book was to show the water names of the five big religions of the world individually. (Pictures 1~5) These all showed beautiful crystals so he wondered why there are problems for these religious groups to get along with each other in the world. 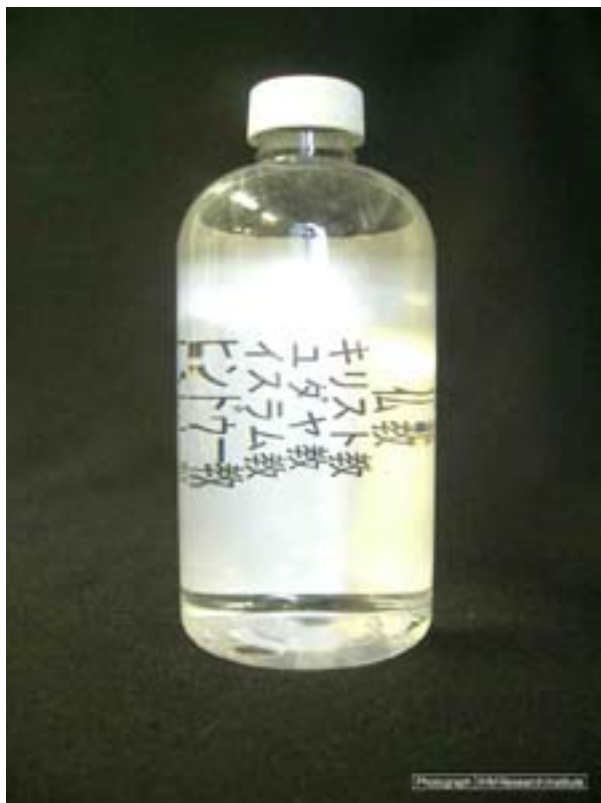

Many questions could be asked of this 'experiment'. For instance, does the water crystal form in response to the purity or consciousness of each religion, and is it affected by the way in which it is interpreted and used in society?

Now the intellect has been addressed, what about the glorious mind? We interpret beauty through the mind's eye. It is a subjective view rather than objective. It can hold us in awe and for a moment cease the chatter as we take it in. Or if a more familiar beauty, that is, something we have previously viewed and named for ourselves as being beautiful, we may only see that which we have allowed ourselves previously to see. The chatter holds together that space previously thought.

So, did you see the image at the end of a point on the top of the crystal in Picture 7? How do you interpret it? However you do is subjective and depends upon whether the intellect or the mind or both are involved. For instance one could speculate which tends to involve the intellect, or one could just allow thoughts, feelings or goose bumps to emerge.

We have looked at scientific research, magical moments and a kind of relationship between the two when beauty can engage the mind when the intellect can grasp a concept.

What does this say about consciousness? What does this say about the role of metaphysics in understanding this evolving consciousness? Patrick has often implied that at the end of a new scientific discovery of this nature a metaphysician waits having visited this knowledge previously through other means and moved on to discovering more. Is then the role of a mapmaker to create certain maps that allows the intellect through scientific endeavours to follow and engage an even wider audience?

It could be said then that when the intellect evolves it is a beautiful thing. Any problem we may have with what we loosely name 'intellect' or 'science' may just be how we are using it or how it may be used against us – as a weapon or a tool. Science or the intellect is just as simple as the meaning of the words. It is how we may hold it in reverence or annoyance in our mind's eye that does any damage.
